Camden Youth Program - Ira Weissman

The Camden Youth Aviation Program was originally founded to introduce the young people of Camden NJ to the world of aviation. It has expanded its focus to include showing the young people of Camden and Southern NJ all aspects of aviation and that there is more to life than what they see in their neighborhoods. Also by introducing them to aviation, we are hoping to give them something to dream about and to inspire them to rise above the limits of their environment. The program is open to all Camden and Southern NJ youth who are interested in aviation. Participation in the Camden Youth Aviation Program is

not limited to any one group or organization, but welcomes all young people who are interested in aviation. The Camden Youth Aviation Program was established under the auspices of the former Camden Police Foundation and the Diocese of Camden's Community Relations Advisory Board. The Camden Youth Aviation Program is incorporated as a Non-Profit Corporation in the State of NJ and is in the process of preparing to submit its paperwork to the IRS to be certified as a 501(c)3 organization.

In the past month, The Camden Youth Aviation Program has made two trips to Philadelphia Airport. Our tours consist of first going into the terminal for an hour and then, re boarding our bus and going

out onto the tarmac for an hour where we drive from one end of the airport to the other. Needless to say the most exciting part of the trip for the young people is watching the aircraft take off and land up close and personal. In total, we took approximately 20 youngsters to the airport this year.

On May 10th, we took 14 youngsters and 10 adults to the McGuire AFB Airshow featuring the Thunderbirds. Groups who went on the trip with us were from the Camden Office of Youth Services, the Camden MALL program and the Catholic Partnership Schools. We had a tremendous time and had a number of very great surprises which we never expected. We almost didn't go because of the weather forecast but decided to take a chance to see a little of the show before any storms rolled in. Before we even got to the field we got a great lesson about generosity. Since this would be the largest event that we had gone to, we wanted to make sure that we could readily identify our young people. We had



reached out to Debbie Madosky of MadHouz promotional goods to find out what it would cost to buy some very colorful shirts and she instead donated the shirts. When we got to the field, Sharon Hunter, a Camden Youth Aviation Program board member and the President of the Hannibal Cox Chapter of the Tuskegee Airmen had Tuskegee Airmen posters signed by 3 of the original Tuskegee Airmen waiting for all the members of our group. After that was a talk and presentation by Steve Schwartz of the Pine Barons RC Club. Then it was onto to meet Tom Beamer of the Northeast Raiders.

This is where the unexpected started to happen. We got a chance to talk to Mark Whisler, the Air Force's F-16 demonstration pilot and got a group photo with him. Next we were taken into the hanger where the Northeast Raiders aircraft were housed and Marty Sheehan talked with our youngsters and had them sit on the wing of his Russian Yak while we took a group photo. Then, it was back onto the field to watch the Thunderbirds. We accidentally wandered into the VIP Area and were asked to leave the area and actually ended up next to the announcer's booth. What we didn't realize was one of the women standing next to us was one of the McGuire squadron commander's wife who made arrangements for us to stay in the area. Then as we were watching the show, Mark Whisler came back over and talked with our young people again. What a great role model and experience for our young people especially showing them what it means to be a part of the aviation community. We got to watch almost $\frac{3}{4}$'s of the Thunderbirds show when the skies finally opened up with a really cold rain.

Then it was back to the bus for the ride home. We owe a great vote of Thanks to Nadine of BJ's Wholesale Club of Maple Shade for supplying both lunches and snacks for the trip, Debbie Madosky of MadHouz for supplying the shirts, Theresa of McGough Bus for our travel arrangements and Chief Thomson and James Bruno of the Camden County Police for allowing us to depart and return to in front of Police Headquarters. Also, we need to Thank Sharon Hunter and the Tuskegee Airmen for the signed posters, Tom Beamer and Marty Sheehan for the great experience with the Northeast Raiders, Steve Schwartz of the Pine Barons RC Club, Mark Whisler for the time that he spent with us and the men and women of the US Air Force who were such great hosts yesterday. Last but not least we need to Thank Monsignor Mannion, Director of Community Relations for the Diocese of Camden who has supported and paid for our trips. The Camden Youth Aviation Program has also had a Bede BD-5 aircraft kit donated to the program. We are currently looking for a location in Camden City where we can build the kit with our young people. Although the BD-5 will never fly, our ultimate goal is to have the young people build an aircraft that they can take flight lessons in.



We are also working with several church groups to try to bring aviation programs to their youth. We have found that many inner city and other under privileged youth even though they may learn about these opportunities in school, have reality for the youngsters. Their reality is what they see on their block. That is what we are trying to change by showing them that there is a different world outside of their neighborhood and that they can also be a part of it. Additionally, we have been made aware that it is not just the inner city youth but

also there are many suburban and rural youth who also need to be given a dream and the opportunity to make that dream a reality.
